Feature Story - Alex Southwell Memorial Tournament

The second Alex Southwell Memorial Golf tournament was held near Red Deer on September 18, 2022. The Southwell family generously donated the proceeds from this tournament to AASRA in 2021 and will be doing so

again this year. AASRA President **Vic McClelland** was prepared to play in the tournament to represent our association and to express our gratitude however he had to cancel due to a bit of bad health.

Alex Southwell was a very active 20-year-old from Red Deer who lost an arm in a motor vehicle accident in 2012. Despite continuing to participate in multiple sports and activities after his recovery he sadly passed away peacefully from complications due to his accident in 2012 at the age of 20.

Peer Visitor/Peer Support Activity

Peer Support coordinator **Chelsea Coates** reports that the Amputee Coalition of Canada indicate that further Peer Support Training for certification may soon be available online. Courses are already being delivered this way by the Amputee Coalition in the US. Manual re-writes are currently being done by the ACC who says that they may be able to deliver training this way as early as November 2022. More information will be provided when available.

Regarding in-person group meetings, Alberta Health Services is still reluctant to open its doors for AASRA to conduct monthly peer support meetings at various locations. Room size to facilitate appropriate distancing, which wasn't an issue pre-Covid, is the current item of focus.

Sports and Recreational Activities Update

In the most recent meeting of the AASRA board of directors Sports Director **Dave Marchand** reported that so far in 2022 fourteen different competitive events have been funded with approximately \$28,000. These events primarily involved golf and sailing athletes.

Dave also told the meeting that approximately \$9,500 has been issued to 20 AASRA members making claims within the Recreational Membership program year-to-date.

Remember, submit your claims for reimbursement from AASRA before the end of the year to ensure they fall within your 2022 allotment. The maximum benefit available to lifetime members is \$750 in the Recreational Membership program and up to \$6,000 in the Competitive Sports Funding program.
